Traditional Sports: School Championships FLOORBALL



Floorball School Championship Qualifiers

Equipment

- Each player on the court is required to use an <u>International Floorball Federation (IFF)</u> approved Floorball stick
 - Floor Hockey or other sticks will not be permitted.
- Goalkeepers are required to wear a Canadian Safety Association (CSA)or IFF approved caged helmet along with leg, chest and hand.
- Note SOO will provide teams with goalie equipment at their respective qualifiers upon request.

Divisioning

- All teams are divisioned to play teams of similar ability.
 - Coaches will fill out a team ranking assessment at registration and can use our <u>Skill</u> <u>Assessments</u> as a guide.
- Team rankings and selected classifications are used to establish division.
- Schools may enter the recreational or competitive category.
 - Recreational: intended for athletes new to the sport, there for fun, not School Championships qualification.
 - Competitive: intended for athletes hoping to qualify and mid-high skill.

The Game

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- 4 players on the court at a time (3 players + 1 goalie)
- The game is played on a gym surface with makeshift boards outlining the court
 - Games are 20 minutes long, broken into two 10-minute halves.
- Includes a 2-minute halftime and a running clock.
- Each team may use one 1-minute time out per game.
- A minimum of 4 players is required to play, and teams can have a max of 8.
- There will be no overtime.
- Teams will not change ends after each period.
- Substitutions: Coaches can make substitutions after any whistle
- Tie breakers are based on the following: succession game points (wins, ties), lowest points against, and random computerized draw.

Competition: Objective: To score more goals than your opponents by shooting the ball into the opposing team's net.

- The game begins with a faceoff at center court.
- If the ball goes out of bounce, **the opposing team will start with the ball in a stationary position** just inside the court where the ball exited the field of play.
- No player, except the goalkeeper, shall stand in the goal crease, on the goal line, nor hold his/her stick in the goal crease.
- After a save, goalies can throw or roll the ball.
- Faceoffs will occur: to start the game/half, each goal, after penalty box infraction, each stoppage of play, off-setting penalties and if it's inconclusive who hit the ball out last.

Penalties

• There will be three categories of penalties: free hits, penalty shots and penalty box minutes. The penalty will be based on the infraction. A list of infractions can be seen on the tech package.

Sticks must remain below the knee when playing the ball and shooting. No body contact should occur at any time

Scoring

- One point shall be awarded for every goal each team scores.
- The team that reaches the first 10 points, or the team with the most points at the end of the 20minute match, wins the game.
