Possession Clarifications

t a goalkeeper deflects the ball out of bounds the goalies team will retain bossession of the ball by way of a goalies throw-in.
Team drops the ball: 1. Loss of Possession: The team that failed to retain the ball after the pass loses
possession.2. Restart: The opposing team gains possession of the ball at the location where the ball was dropped.
3. Restart Rules: To restart play, the player in possession must maintain a

Restart Rules: To restart play, the player in possession must maintain a minimum distance of 5 feet from the nearest defensive player, ensuring fair play.

Penalties

Dribble Fault: Once a player stops dribbling, they can no longer dribble the ball. A change of possession will happen if player does so.
Foul: If a player is fouled, their team is awarded a throw-in from the sidelines. Penalty Shot (12 feet away from goal) a) If an offensive player is fouled while shooting b) If another player other than the goalie enters the crease
For minor misconduct, a verbal warning followed by a yellow card may be given.
Any further warning will lead to a red card and player being sent off for the game.
